SELF-EVALUATION OF CANDIDATE ENTREPRENEUR

Addressed to refuges and migrants willing to start a small Business

To identify entrepreneurial knowledge and skills

Information for Refugees Support Organizations (RSOs)

The aim of the questionnaire that follows (paragraph 4) is to act as a means of identifying the level of entrepreneurial knowledge and skills of the person who completes it. It is specially developed for refugees and migrants willing to start a personal or small business.

The questionnaire is available in two forms:

- (a) An online version given as an excel file: In this form the refuge/migrant is able to complete the questionnaire in the "*Quiz*" worksheet. In this case the results concerning the level of knowledge and skills are presented automatically. The responder can see the level of his/her general competence in the "*Score*" worksheet. More specific information on entrepreneurial ability can be seen in the worksheet entitled "*Strengths and Weaknesses*" given in the form of a spider graph.
- (b) A paper based version given as a pdf file: The questionnaire should be given to the refuge/migrant willing to test his/her knowledge and skills. Then a person from the RSO helping the responder should evaluate the answers selected, based on the scores of the answers for each question (see paragraphs 4 and 5 – scores are not presented to responders).

In any case it is recommended that the responder after completing the questionnaire should collaborate with the supporting organization to get advice on the level of his/her entrepreneurial knowledge and skills and on what kind of training path can follow to improve them.

1. General sections of the questionnaire

For the development of the questionnaire the questions are grouped in seven (7) categories/sections, which help in better identifying entrepreneurial knowledge and skills in those different domains. They are:

Section 1: General Characteristics (4 questions) Section 2: General Skills-Abilities (4 questions) Section 3: General Business Skills-Abilities (4 questions) Section 4: Financial Management Skills (4 questions) Section 5: Management Skills (3 questions) Section 6: Self-knowledge-Creativity-Motivation-Perseverance (3 questions) Section 7: Risk Management-Troubleshooting (2 questions)

2. Scores assigned to answers of each question

For each question there is a score representing the level of knowledge and skills of the responder, as follows:

- 0 = Zero or Not at all
- 2 = Basic or Guided
- 3 = Adequate or Beginner
- 4 = Good or Intermediate
- 5 = Excellent or Experienced

The scores for the answers for each question are given in the list of questions and answers given bellow, but **the questionnaire presented to the responders does not contain the headings of the sections** so that the respondent is unsuspecting. The total of 24 questions can also be scattered (shuffled) at any order.

3. Instructions for completing the questionnaire, given to responders

Open the worksheet called "*Quiz*". After reading each question, chose the alternative answer that best expresses yourself.

Please have in mind that in order to have an objective picture of your profile, you should chose, with as much sincerity and accuracy as possible the answer that expresses your own feelings, attitude and behavior, as they are really are, and not as you would like them to be.

After answering all twenty four (24) questions, open the next worksheet called "*Score*". There you will find the score you get and relevant explanatory remarks about your self-evaluation concerning the business profile.

Finally, open the worksheet called "*Strengths and weaknesses*" in terms of *your entrepreneurial ability*". There you will find the score you get about for each category of skills and abilities concerning entrepreneurship.

Section 1: General Characteristics

1. Interest for the Business

5. Final total score and categorization of knowledge and skills.

(levels having some correspondence to the first 6 levels of the EntreComp Framework)

After answering the questionnaire, a total score is produced together with a classification of the respondent's level of knowledge and skills, his/her business profile (classification into categories of entrepreneur).

There are 6 categories, based on final total score are as follows:

Score equal to 120:

Excellent: You are a born businessman. If you do not have your own business now, start as soon as possible. Success awaits you.

Score 109-119:

Very good: You definitely have everything you need to succeed in your own business. Do not hesitate. Your success in the business world is guaranteed.

Score 88-108:

Good: You have the virtues of a successful entrepreneur, with some weaknesses. The analysis given as a "spider chart" will help you identify the points where you are lagging behind. There are two ways to bridge the gap: Entrepreneurial training or following the specific 9conversations program for this purpose.

Score 67-87:

Sufficient: Entrepreneurship is not among your strong skills. On the other hand you have significant room for improvement in order to be able to start your own business.

Score 46-66:

Moderate: The prospect of succeeding as an entrepreneur is questionable. You have some weaknesses that may overshadow some of the good features you have. If you insist on doing it, seek more education and training and use all the perseverance you have. You might encounter great difficulties on your way.

Score below or equal to 45:

Unsatisfactory: It seems that you should forget the dream of becoming an entrepreneur. It is not advisable to get involved in starting your own business.
