AMIF Funds

The Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund (AMIF) was set up for the period 2014-20, with a total of EUR 3.137 billion for the seven years. It will promote the efficient management of migration flows and the implementation, strengthening and development of a common Union approach to asylum and immigration. This Fund will contribute to the achievement of four specific objectives:

- **Asylum**: strengthening and developing the <u>Common European Asylum System</u> by ensuring that EU legislation in this field is efficiently and uniformly applied;
- **Legal migration and integration**: supporting legal <u>migration</u> to EU States in line with the labour market needs and promoting the effective <u>integration</u> of non-EU nationals;
- Return: enhancing fair and effective <u>return</u> strategies, which contribute to combating <u>irregular migration</u>, with an emphasis on sustainability and effectiveness of the return process;
- **Solidarity**: making sure that EU States which are most affected by migration and asylum flows can count on solidarity from other EU States.

What's a Steering group in IPOCAD

Chamber of composition and management of different sectorial competences, that are functionally combined according to an integrated approach, in terms of migration policies and integration.













Structure

Inter-Directorate Steering Group with governance, coordination, guidance and overall monitoring functions; context for discussion and in-depth consideration of the development of activities.

It consists of representatives of regional Councillors for work, training and social policies according to an integrated approach, in terms of migration policies and integration.











Structure

Local Steering Group: with governance and territorial coordination functions.

Composed of representatives of Municipalities, Socio-Welfare Districts, Schools, ASL, Employment Centres, Provincial Centres for Adult Education, Third Sector Institutions, realized in a territorial context and consisting of the project reference persons, who work together to the integrated takeover of the migrant and his family












Local Steering Groups in Lazio Region



What has each action achieved? ACTION 1

A total of 195 activities were carried out by **schools**, with a high prevalence of:

courses to strengthen the Italian language (66.7% of the total) workshops for the recovery of school dropout (12.8%), workshops for the enhancement of cultural identity (9.2%) guidance actions in support of the school pathway (6.7%).











What has each action achieved? ACTION 2

25 one stop shop 1440 hours of intercultural mediation provided 30 active mediators 1720 beneficiaries reached

The elements of success can be seen in the **motivation** of **individual** operators to participate in the realization of the **common objective**, to be able to intercept foreign citizens to better know their needs and their history.

"Meeting" is the right word for some local actors who, in some districts, have met again thanks to the project, to Rebuild a Territorial Network, on which to rely over time.

Ipocad has provided the opportunity to consolidate, expand and renew local networks for the inclusion of migrants.

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What has each action achieved? ACTION 4

Training needs emerged and managed thanks to collective and/or individualized accompanying pathways

- technical skills for associative management, such as the ability to design and report, fundraising, communication, organization of events;
- internal management skills, such as procedures for formalising the association or for registering lists and registers;
- territorial competences to build and maintain networks and connections with other public and private stakeholders of the territory.










Destinatari IPOCAD n. 3.282 al 30/9/18 per nationality














IPOCAD Beneficiaries n. 3.282 Permit of Stay
